

Thanks to pro bono legal help, **CAMBA Housing Ventures**, **Inc.** recently closed on the financing for its Morris Manor supportive housing project in Brooklyn. The legal team formed an affiliate corporation to develop new permanent affordable housing, reviewed loan documents for construction loans totaling close to \$6.6 million and an equity closing of just under \$2 million, and negotiated a partnership agreement with the equity investor. As a result, this project will provide 46 units of permanent affordable housing for low-income residents and individuals with psychiatric disabilities moving from shelters or transitional housing.
